## **Old News, But Still Relevant!**

### **Outside Playtime**

The rain and cold have come! Please remember to send your child with a warm coat, rain footwear (boots, shoes that can get wet, etc), and warm enough clothing. We will be going outside every recess unless the weather is *really* bad...we know that it is so important for our students – and ourselves! – to get fresh air and exercise, even if it is wet and cold outside. It would also be really helpful for you to send an extra change of clothes in their backpacks,



in case they get wet! That might save you a trip to the school to come to the rescue if they fall in a puddle.

## **Garbage on the Playground**

Please have a look around you after using the playground or field before/after school and on the weekends, to pick up any juice boxes, wrappers, or other items that may have fallen to the ground while your kidlets are playing. Before school started we had an amazing group of kids and families who helped clean up our school grounds, and we want to keep it clean and tidy!
